

CONNECT After-school Program

CONNECT is an after-school program that will provides students with snacks, stories (both Bible and Character-building), crafts, games (board games, puzzles, group games), relationship building, occasional presentations/talks by community leaders, and a general good time. There will be plenty of adult supervision, along with teen helpers to make this a safe, fun experience for your child. This is the second year for this program. We had a wonderful time together last year.

We meet on **Tuesdays after school until 5:00** at **Rittman United Methodist Church**. Students will be met at dismissal time every Tuesday that school is in session **from September 17th through the beginning of May**. We will walk from the school to the church at **211 N. Metzger Ave.** regardless of the weather. Parents or other listed adults will **pick up the students at the church at 5:00 and sign them out**.

Please fill out the registration form and return it to the school with your child's other paperwork. If you don't want to fill out an additional emergency medical form, simply check and sign the box that the school may share your child's information with the **CONNECT** program. The school will forward the registration form and emergency medical form to **Pastor Ruthie** for processing. This paperwork can also be returned to the church. **Registration accepted any time!**

Safety measures will always be used. **If a child doesn't arrive at the assigned pick-up area and parents have not notified the school or Pastor Ruthie at the above contacts of the child not attending on a certain day, a parent will be called to verify the absence.**

We understand that children sometimes have changing schedules throughout the year. Children may be registered at other times throughout the year, may drop out and return later, and may be picked up at other times than 5:00, if necessary.
