

On Easters since then, I think of my dad and smile, and I thank God for the time that I was able to have with my dad. I was a Daddy's Girl! God has given me hope that my dad is living eternally with Christ.

> God loved each one of us, He gave His only Son; And as we believe in Him, our new life has just begun.




Join us for a great chance to learn more about God's Word!
