We need to be cautious in what we allow to influence us; including media, technology, politics, beliefs, temptations, etc. We are reminded in Romans 6:20-23 this: "When you were slaves of sin, you were free from the control of righteousness. What consequences did you get from doing things that you are now ashamed of? The outcome of those things is death. But now that you have been set free from sin and become slaves to God, you have the consequence of a holy life, and the outcome is eternal life. The wages that sin pays are death, but God's gift is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." This is True Freedom!

ANNUAL CONFERENCE 2021

Bishop Tracy S. Malone presided over the 52nd session of the East Ohio Annual Conference. This year's theme was *Christ Alive in Us!* and the guiding scripture was Ephesians 2:8-10 (NIV): *"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith – and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God – not by works, so that no one can boast. For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared <i>in advance for us to do."*

The services, celebrations, and business sessions were broadcast live from the John S. Knight Center in Akron June 16-19. Held virtually again this year due to ongoing pandemic, 624 registered clergy members and the 577 registered lay members viewed conference and voted remotely. The virtual experience was better this year than last, however, there were still some difficulties; one being that some of our local delegates because of a power outage in the Rittman, Marshallville, Creston, Sterling, and some of Seville area, which occurred on Friday for much of the day.

Some of the adaptive ministries of East Ohio Conference pastors, congregations and faith communities were highlighted throughout conference in the form of Christ Alive in Us! videos that focused on creative ministry partnerships, missions, youth, camps, spiritual formation, community outreach, and racial justice. *(This is copied and adapted from Rick Wolcott's report.)*



Pray with Boldness and Confidence


