Fireside Chat



Dear friends,

In the summer of 1990, just after Ken and I left this church to serve Community UMC in Elyria, we took Ellen to Vandercook College of Music located on the south side of Chicago. It was located across a busy street from the dormitories of Illinois Institute of Technology (IIT). Vandercook is a small college - only one building at that time. IIT allowed the female students to live in the girls' dorm on campus. The dorms were located on the south end of the campus. The talk the police had with the girls on safety indicated going south from the school on foot was a "no no" and not even recommended in a car. The girls who stayed at school in the evening to study and practice were escorted across the street to the dorms or to their cars by the male students who were paid to secure the building at night. I still feel indebted to these young men who kept Ellen and her fellow women students' safe for the four years she was there. Our Bishop served as DS in Chicago and knows the area well and understands why my prayer life grew during those four years.

In September, Pastor Ruthie told us about a conference mission project of helping to build a women's dorm at Africa University in Zimbabwe. If you are at least in your 50s and you were a part of a United Methodist Church, you may remember when our Conference helped build the University. It has since grown and is a very respected university. Having enough housing for students has been a problem for the last few years, especially safe housing for the women to live in and who now may have to walk long distances through parts of town where you wouldn't want your daughters to have to walk by themselves and they don't have male escorts like Ellen did. Pastor Ruthie mentioned in passing one Sunday of the request the Conference was making for an offering in September and you responded in love. Over \$590.00 was given above your other offerings to help build a girls' dorm. If you missed the announcement and would like to make a gift to help build the dorm, put your money or check in an envelope marked for Africa U. Dorm and send or bring it to the church. The money can still be sent in to the Conference by the end of the year.

We've done this plus kept our apportionments up to date and all bills paid. I say, "God is good all the time." And you said, "All the time, God is good!" Praise God!
