Lent Is Coming! Does It Matter?

When you hear it announced that it is Lent, do you know what is meant? If you do, does it matter to you?

I don't ever remember hearing the word "Lent" when I was growing up in the church. The first time I remember hearing it was in college, and it took me a while to realize how important it was before I understood what it was really all about. I hope that this helps you to understand it better, and that it brings you closer to the Lord this Lenten Season.

Lent is a time of fasting during the 40 days (not including Sundays) before Easter, which begins on Ash Wednesday. It began as the remembrance of Jesus' 40 days of fasting in the desert. It is a time of prayer, repentance, sacrifice, and self-denial. The purpose for it was to draw closer to God and to prep one's self for Easter.

This time of Lent has evolved over the years. It has been known as a time of fasting from certain foods; like meat, chocolates, all sweets, candy, or some other food that is desirable. It has also been a time of giving up luxuries in order to live a more simple life during these 40 days. More recently some people have added the giving up of their involvement on technologies, like TV, internet, video games, computer, cell phones, etc. Others have added to the amount of time that they give to serve others, added to the amount of money they give to the church or to missions, or added to the amount of time in prayer or in Bible reading.

The most important part of Lent is your repentance and committing to draw closer to God by changing at least one thing during this time that helps you focus on the Lord each time that you think about what you have committed to do or not do. Ash Wednesday Service is a good way to come to the Lord in repentance for sins that are still weighing you down and in promise of your Lenten commitment for the coming 40 days, as you hold on to the hope of the Resurrection of Christ that will be celebrated at Easter.

Mark 1:13 tells of Jesus' time of fasting in the desert, "And He was in the wilderness forty days being tempted by Satan; and He was with the wild beasts, and the angels were ministering to Him."


