Mary's Meanderings

As we are in the Lenten Season and are approaching Good Friday and the Passion of Christ I thought it would be interesting to look at people's last words. Deuteronomy 33:26-29 gives us the last words of Moses: "There is no one like the God of Jeshurun (Israel), who rides across the heavens to help you and on the clouds in His majesty. The eternal God is your refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms. He will drive out your enemies before you, saying, "Destroy them!" So Israel will live in safety; Jacob will dwell secure in a land of grain and new wine, where the heavens drop dew. Blessed are you, Israel! Who is like you, a people saved by the Lord? He is your shield and helper and your glorious sword. Your enemies will cower before you, and you will tread on their heights."

King David says in 2 Samuel 23:1-4: "The oracle of David son of Jesse, the oracle of the man raised up as the ruler chosen by the God Jacob, Israel's beloved singer of songs: The Lord's Spirit spoke through me; His word was on my tongue. The God of Israel spoke, the Protector of Israel spoke to me. The one who rules fairly among men, the one who rules in the fear of God, is like the light of morning when the sun comes up, a morning in which there are no clouds. He is like the brightness after rain that produces grass from the earth." And David's final words to Solomon: when David was close to death, he told Solomon his son: "I am about to die. Be strong and become a man! Do the job the Lord your God has assigned you by following His instructions and obey His rules, commandments, regulations, and laws as written in the Law of Moses. Then you will succeed in all you do and seek to accomplish." 1 Kings 2:1-9.

The last words of Jesus on the cross: "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do. To the thief: 'Today shalt thou be with me in paradise.' To His mother, Mary: 'Woman, behold thy Son.' Then He said to John, the disciple: 'Behold your mother'. My God, my God, why hast Thou forsaken me? I thirst. It is finished. Father, into Thy hands I commend My spirit. "Saint Stephen while he was being stoned to death: "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit! Lord, do not hold this sin against them!" When he had said this, he died. Acts 7: 59-60. Paul in 2 Timothy 4:6-8: "For I am already being poured out as an offering, and the time for me to depart is at hand. I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith! Finally the crown of righteousness is reserved for me. The Lord, the righteous Judge, will award it to me in that day-and not to me only, but also to all who have set their affection on His appearing." "But, according to His promise, we are waiting for new heavens and a new earth, in which righteousness truly resides. Therefore, dear friends, since you are waiting for these things, strive to be found at peace, without spot or blemish, when you come into His presence...grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be the honor both now and on that eternal day." Peter in 2 Peter 3:14-18. The Apostle John: "I testify to everyone who hears the words of the prophecy contained in this book: If anyone adds to them, God will add to him the plagues described in this book. And if anyone takes away from the words of this book of prophecy, God will take away his share in the tree of life and in the holy city that are described in this book. The one who testifies to these things says, "Yes, I am coming soon!" Amen! Come, Lord Jesus! The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all." Revelation 22:18-21.

Last Words of Atheists

Joseph Coveney, American Atheist: "I die as I live. I disbelieve in God, the Bible, and the Christian religion. Karel Soucek, Canadian stuntman: "There is no Heaven or Hell; there is no God. It is all a myth. You're born, you live, one day you die and that is it." Sir Thomas Scott, Chancellor of England: "Until this moment I thought there was neither a God nor a hell. Now I know and feel that there are both, and I am doomed to perdition by the just judgment of the Almighty." Voltaire, famous anti-Christian atheist: "I have swallowed nothing but smoke. I have

Such is the fate of him who has been called the great Napoleon. What an abyss between my deep misery and the eternal kingdom of Christ!"
